Covering Clark County in Prayer From the National Day of Prayer to Pentecost May 2 - 19, 2013 (18 days, 24 hours)

Thank you for your heart to pray! As you pray, God hears and acts!

Here are some starting-point suggestions to pray for your congregation and for the county.

For your congregation:

Ephesians 6:18 calls us to pray for “all the saints.”
“Praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints...”

- We would grow in the grace and knowledge of Jesus (2 Peter 3:18)
- We would demonstrate the fruit of His Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23)
- We would be “salt and light” to those who do not yet know the Savior (Matthew 5:13-16)
- We would humble ourselves, pray, seek His face and His ways, and turn from our ways to His ways (2 Chronicles 7:14)
- That we would love God supremely (Matthew 22:37)

For Leaders of your congregation:

- They would know God’s call on their lives (1 Peter 4:10-11)
- They would be encouraged by the saints (Galatians 6:6)
- They would shepherd God’s flock (1 Peter 5:2-4)
- They would boldly walk through the open doors for ministry (Ephesians 6:19-20, Colossians 4:2-4)

For those who do not yet know the Savior

- They would know your congregation loves them (Matthew 22:39)
- They would hear the message of Christ, believe it, and follow Him (Matthew 4:19-20)

For the county:

Jeremiah 29:7 calls us to pray for the peace and prosperity of our city. “Also, seek the peace and prosperity of the city to which I have carried you into exile. Pray to the LORD for it, because if it prospers, you too will prosper.”

Pray for the **peace** and **prosperity** of people in the following areas of cultural influence.

- Business
- Education
- Family
- Government
- Health/Medicine
- Ministries
- Media

Proverbs 31:8-9 calls us to speak up for those who have no voice. “Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute.
⁹Speak up and judge fairly; defend the rights of the poor and needy.”

Pray that the **rights** of those who are most vulnerable in our county would be upheld. That their **needs** would be met.

- Widows and orphans
- The un/under employed
- The disabled
- The addicted/abused
- Those from minority cultures
- The elderly
